HISTORY OF AFTERNOON TEA

Tea, the quintessential English drink, was a latecomer to the British shores. Although the custom of drinking tea dates back to the 3rd millennium BC in China, it did not appear in England until the 17th Century.

Afternoon tea was introduced to Britain by Anna, the Seventh Duchess of Bedford, in 1840. Evening meals were served fashionably late, at 8 o'clock, and the Duchess would find herself hungry at 4 o'clock.

The Duchess asked that a tray of tea, bread and butter (the Earl of Sandwich had had the idea that you could put a filling between two slices of bread) and a cake be brought to her room. This became a habit and she soon invited friends to join her.

The pause for tea soon became a fashionable event where ladies would change into long gowns, gloves and hats and gather in the drawing room between 4 and 5 o'clock.
